MEMBERSHIP

Our proposed budget is looking at expenditures to ensure Drama Queensland can continue to provide resources, support and PD for our members and working to draw more members back to Drama Queensland. This will be explored further in both our Business Manager's and VP Planning reports.

PUBLICATIONS

This year was another huge year for our Publications suite, under the guidance of our Vice President Communications, Sam Neill with DQ News, our new look Journal. With it's second year in its new look DQ News has become a highly visual, easy to read, well edited review of what's on, what we should know, what's hot and where to next. Planning and Forthcoming Portfolio Project/Activities for 2023/2024

In 2024 we commit to the supporting teachers with the new syllabus familiarisation, National Curriculum requirements and PD, and keep developing our work in publications, social media and website with a strong focus on advocacy materials. Drama Queensland strives to find ways to engage with Primary teachers, both specialists and generalists to ensure quality teaching and learning across all year levels in the Arts. Our hosting of the 'new look' State conference will showcase the extraordinary talents and skills of educators here in Queensland. We will also focus on digitising the archives and use of our new website.

Lastly, Drama Queensland will advocate with the QAAE and keep working with the QCAA and other stakeholders.

The major focus for 2023 should be to keep our membership informed, educated and aware of the imminent changes to the Senior Schooling and ACARA education landscape as reviews of both of these curriculum continue their review process and advocating for the subject. It is vital that Drama Queensland be involved in these process to ensure clear, timely communication with our members, professional development in this arena and advocacy from our organization on behalf of our members.

Other specific goals include:

- Continuing to build the website traffic
- Sharpen the publications suite to ensure no overlap between the variety of publications but also continuing to serve the needs of all members
- Another highly successful State Conference
- Examining the PD space to ensure that we are continually providing relevant and useful PDs, including options for recorded workshops
 Reframing the approach to Regional Round Up to increase the number of registrations and delegates in attendance
- Considering the calendar and commitments of the DQ committee members to ensure maximum attendance at meetings and sharing responsibilities across the committee
- Continue 'induction day' in January where we go over all portfolios and trees of care.
- Continue to use the 'DQ cheat sheet' with information about committee meetings, management system and other key information about the running of the association.
- Continue supporting the 'Communities of Practice' across the state by encouraging members to attend meetings organised throughout the state.
- Work on how to re engage and strengthen ties with primary teachers, including how to work with generalist teachers in the position of teaching the Arts. Focus on PD opportunities.
- Provide current advice and information through egroup and social media platforms.
- Proof and edit all DQ publications thoroughly to maintain a high level of quality and professionalism in all of our communications and publications.
- Ensure publications are released in a timely manner and communication with Business manager, President, Vice President and Industry partners is clear and early.
- To consistently review and edit the website content to ensure that it is up to date, current and accurate, sustaining its mission as the 'go to' place for all things DQ
- To continue to grow a valid, informed and respected Social Media presence
- Reinvigorate our communities of practice to ensure networking and sharing opportunities for teachers across the state
- To continue to increase our membership numbers by investigating how to make DQ membership highly desirable through exclusive offers, events and opportunities available to members only
- To revisit the Strategic Plan to ensure that the goals are still valid and achievable and adjusting these and the timeline as necessary

GENERAL ADMINISTRATION

ADMINISTRATION OFFICE AND COMMUNICATIONS

Apologies for not being able to attend this AGM in person.

Drama Queensland continues to operate using a virtual office, with the major communication channel being email.

Face to face communication with the Business Manager occurs at professional development events and management committee meetings only. For this reason, email is the preferred method of communication with the Business Manager.

Due to fraud protection laws Drama Queensland has to provide an address that is not a PO Box when managing a merchant facility and online shopping program. As such the Business Manager's address is listed as the registered office for Drama Queensland.

As Drama Queensland does not reside in an office space and is run out of the Business Manager's home, resources and archives are stored in a shared storage box with Drama Australia in Milton, Brisbane. Both organisations share the costs associated with both storage and insurance. In this partnership Drama Queensland pays the initial invoice supplied by Kennards Milton and then invoices Drama Australia for their ½ share.

In 2023 Drama Queensland advised Drama Australia that they will be looking for alternate secure storage options as the storage rental price has increased significantly, whilst stock and documentation is actually depleting. A number of other storage options have been explored, with quotes being obtained by outer suburb storage businesses. Whilst maintaining the security and insurance safety net required for documentation storage, these businesses seem to have lower hire rates.

In the past Drama Queensland stored items at the previous Business Manager's home and prior to that at a University. Unfortunately, due to the safety of stored documents, privacy laws, insurance changes for those storing the items and the ability to access items freely, it was determined that these are not options for Drama Queensland.

A decision will be made in early 2024, with a working party from the Drama Queensland Committee moving all documentation and resources from the storage facility.

Drama Australia has been asked if they would like to continue sharing, however, price discussions, location and size might affect this decision.

FINANCIAL REPORT

The 2022/2023 audit has been completed by Anderson, Munro and Wyllie Chartered Accountants under the guidance of Brian Tucker Accounting. The auditors were satisfied that the financial report accurately reflects the financial position of the association.

In the 2022/2023 financial year Drama Queensland reports a loss from ordinary activities of \$13,791.74.

As a not-for-profit organisation, Drama Queensland planned to access retained funds in 2022/2023 to support its members and budgeted for a loss of approx -\$25,000 which was approved at the 2022 AGM. The 2022/2022 audit shows a reported loss of less than originally budgeted for.

This loss can be attributed to:

- An increase in pricing across the board in all services we utilise and receive, however, no
 increase in membership fees or conference rates to offset this.
- Double payments for services during the handover period between the outgoing and incoming conference managers.
- A more expensive and celebratory AGM in 2022.
- A larger conference, which meant services like security, technical set up and running needed to be added at additional cost to the association.

Whilst reporting a loss, retained Profits at the end of the 2022/2023 financial year were \$60,752.04 which places Drama Queensland in a positive financial position as of September 30, 2023.

These retained Profits also is consistent with not-for-profit law which allows associations to retain enough funds to cover any employee's wages and other key expenses if an issue was to arise. However, allocating all other incoming or retained funds to support the membership.

Cash at bank at the end of the financial year was \$72,629.25 with \$325.00 in trade and other assets.

The Trade Debtor amount presented in 2022/2023 was higher than the past and this is due to a number of invoices being issued and remaining open after the financial year closed. These invoices continue to be followed up for payment.

All Trade debtors listed in the MYOB financial program prior to October 1, 2022, will be deleted as these are open invoices and memberships/resources etc were not supplied.

INCOME

The total income for 2022/2023 was \$98, 806.43.

Key income streams for 2022/2023:

- Our State Conference saw income of \$48, 780.41.
- Our Industry Partnerships and conference advertising were once gain a key income stream of \$19,545.42.
- Membership fees were also a key stream of income with the association reporting \$22, 941.12 across all membership types.

EXPENDITURE

Total Expenditure in 2022/2023 was \$112,598.17.

Key expenditure items for 2022/2023:

Administration costs of \$46,024.00 (which in 2022/2023 saw the combination of both Business and Conference Manger wages, an increase in Superannuation to 11% and included a handover period where double wages/fees were being paid).

Conference Expenses of \$30, 452.54 (In 2022/2023 does not include the Conference Manager Fees as per above)

Our annual journal DQ Says, which cost \$2,012.91 to produce and around \$1,500 for postage.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

2023 STATE CONFERENCE: ELEVATE

In 2023 Drama Queensland hosted one of it's largest conferences in history. It was so wonderful to see so many new and returning faces at this event.

ODYSSEY was held at a new venue for Drama Queensland, The Stuartholme School. Survey's from the conference showed that delegates loved the new venue, it's catering and ability to host many great workshops.

The total income for the State Conference in the 2022/2023 financial year was \$48,780.41 and the total expenditure was approx 52,000 (\$2000 was additional handover fees, \$1500 was last minute technical fees for filming). Leaving Drama Queensland reporting a loss of approx -\$3,219.59 for the 2023 State Conference.

In the 2022/2023 financial year Drama Queensland released their new 25 Activity posters. These resources include a poster and access to a list of 25 games per poster. Each delegate at the 2023 State Conference ODYSSEY were gifted one of the posters and a number were raffled off in

prizes. At the conference delegates purchased \$1817.81 worth of additional posters, with sales after the conference totalling \$421.84.

We continued to see a small number of sales of the resources: Aurelian (4 copies + 2 more after the EFY) and Dramatic Encounters (4 copies).

Now delivering through Vimeo Boy Girl Wall saw payments for sales in the 2022/2023 period totalling \$3,361.76. 2/3 of the sale price will be paid to the creatives in the next financial year._

MEMBERSHIP

During the 2022/2023 financial year 261 memberships were purchased through Drama Queensland's online shop and through PD registrations. that membership numbers fluctuate. Drama Queensland reported to Drama Australia a membership figure of 300 which was taken on the census date of June 30, 2022.

Portfolio Project/Activity Highlights 2022/2023

2023 has been an incredibly HUGE year for Drama Queensland. This year wouldn't have been possible without the incredible and tireless work of the exec. Thank you Steff, Alaana, Scott and Sam for all of your support. A massive thanks also to our president Stephanie Tudor, your creativity, leadership and determination to respond to the challenges that are presented has ensured that all members of DQ have been supported and heard.

Thank you to our amazing advocacy team, Chloe, Phoebe, Anna and Justin – it has been a roller coaster of a year but thank you all for your endless energy and creativity in our membership space.

As Vice President Planning/Finance my role continues to oversee the budget and business transactions of the organisation and works closely with the Business Manager. The Vice President Planning also oversees the Portfolio of Membership.

Membership

Drama Queensland is a not-for-profit organisation, and we focus on advocating for Drama educators across our state and in 2023 we have aimed to continue to build upon our numbers through connection with our members both in person and online opportunities. Our members continue to be our priority.

I am happy to report we have seen an increase in membership this year – we reported a membership of 300 in June and currently are sitting at 272. As membership is the driving force of Drama Queensland, we are making several strategic decisions to increase our membership including: a member mail out; a school re- sign campaign; data base updates and a complete overhaul of our website.

A special thanks to Pheobe Ballard for her work with our Regional members. Thank you for all energy and commitment to our Regional members – DQ is lucky to have you working in this space.

Audit

Like in 2022, I am happy to report again that we are in a strong financial position in which our current cash and cash equivalents, as of 30th September, 2022 total \$ 72,629.25. This has allowed the committee to make strong decisions over the coming year, to support our members and advocate our subject.

The Audited Statement of Accounts records a loss of \$13,791.74 for the 2022/23 financial year. As Alaana explained in her Business Manager report this loss can be attributed to our very successful but larger conference, which included double payments for services during the handover period between the outgoing and incoming conference managers.

Planning and Forthcoming Portfolio Project/Activities for 2022/2023

Working Budget

Presented is the proposed working budget for 2023/2024. Our budget for the current financial year is based on the association's priorities and strategic decisions.

While we have budget conservatively to align with supporting members, adjustments have been made in this years budget to reflect current costing. This year our working budget will work with a deficit of \$10,120.05. We present this deficit with the knowledge that we have adequate funds to cover this projected deficit and knowing this will enable us to provide our members with relevant and timely resources and opportunities in this changing face of education.

Total projected income for 2023/2024 Financial Year is \$ \$60,290.60. Key parts of this income include our Industry Partnerships, state conference registration and membership fees.

Our proposed deficit derives from our planned expenditure of \$70,410.65 which is key to supporting our members during this 2023/2024 financial year. Key expenditure items include:

- Website redesign and launch: a completely new website is being constructed and will be managed by a contractor. This site will improve our data and improve access to teacher resources.
- New Computer for Business Manager: The Drama Queensland Computer is now older and is running out of internal storage and it's capabilities are not current to support the online nature of the organisation. As this item is an integral part of the running of Drama Queensland it is imperative that the Business Manager purchases a new computer that also includes online support and guidance on how to transfer key business items, in the coming weeks.

Other expenditure items that align with current figures will see a slight inflation as per each financial year.

Membership

As a non-for profit organisation our income is derived from our membership fees. Our Membership fees have not increased since 2018. The committee would like to propose an 15% increase to our membership fees to align with current inflation rates. This increase is due to the yearly rise of general business costs, inflation, allowing Drama Queensland to support it's membership further and supply what they requested in our 2023 membership survey of resources and PDs.

Motion:

After many years at the same price, Drama Queensland will need to increase the membership prices to meet inflation in all other areas of expenditure.

The committee has proposed the following increases (15%):

- Corporate Membership \$325 to \$373.75
- Individual Membership \$100 to \$115
- Concession Membership \$70 to \$80.50

These increases will allow us to cover the rising costs of inflation and to better represent the needs of our membership. If this motion is not passed, DQ budget will need to report further deficit for 2023/2024.

MOTION:

The Drama Queensland membership accepts the proposed increases in membership fees.

Professional Development

Drama Queensland will provide the usual PDs and will also instigate some new opportunities in response to member feedback. Our Professional Development line up will include Subject Report Webinar, State Conference, Pot Luck, and Toolkits. All members will have access to increased resources, including professionally written and published units of work and printed classroom posters.

- Continue to examine each professional development opportunity to ensure that PD is cost neutral or makes slight profit.
- Continue to connect with tertiary bodies, looking for opportunities to support students' practicum experiences and beyond.
- Work alongside our industry partners to create exclusive DQ member opportunities.
- Communicate membership increase transparently and support members in accessing members with the price increase

Portfolio Project/Activity Highlights 2022/2023

Portfolio Project/Activity Highlights 2023

I have thoroughly enjoyed my first year on the DQ committee and am beginning to find my momentum within the regional sphere as I approach the end of my first year in Cairns.

At the conference this year, I gathered the other drama teachers from my area and had a sit down conversation with them about what support they would like from Drama Queensland. The consensus from this small group was to find connection and then look at PD and workshops for the teachers in FNQ.

I called Ang Gould (a long-standing member of DQ and a teacher at Trinity Bay) who let me know that she had a list of teachers in Cairns, however she was not sure how many were still working. Ang sent out an email correspondence to these teachers asking them to let her know if they were still active and letting them know about DQ's intentions for regional teachers. I discussed these conversations with Lucy, and we decided to begin collecting the names and information of teachers in regional Queensland so we could communicate effectively as well as discovering how many teachers are active and engaged with DQ. Lucy created a Microsoft form which was sent out and advertised in the DQ communications. There were 11 responses from teachers in the Cairns region. Thankfully, I am already connected to ten of these members socially. I have discussed with my school (Saint Augustine's College) about the possibility of hosting a DQ event for Cairns teachers and was given full support.

Planning and Forthcoming Portfolio Project/Activities for 2023/2024

I look forward to the opportunities 2024 will present for the DQ community of FNQ. My priority is offering a social gathering for the teachers to come together and get to know one another. I plan to use this gathering to gain a clearer indication of what these teachers want from DQ for 2024.

Some ideas for events I have are

- Resource sharing, looking at units of work as well as Senior assessment items.
- Screenings of events and PDs to provide to community and interaction. This could be paired with practical activities that align with the activities taking place at these events in Brisbane.
- PD's run by both DQ members and external facilitators (e.g. Members of committee and exec, Shock Therapy, Jason Klarwein)
- Petitioning Theatre companies to tour FNQ more frequently.
- Petitioning QCAA to provide training in FNQ.
- Attending productions that do tour.
- Connecting with teaching artists in FNQ to provide PDs.
- Allowing opportunity for cross-school collaboration and support (Projects, Musicals, Performances)
- Social catch ups either at school or at bars/restaurants across Cairns.
- "Mini-conference" for those unable to fly to Brisbane. Screenings and workshops that take place simultaneously with Brisbane conference.
- A more ambitious future idea is to host the conference in FNQ.
